

## Concealed Pistol License

(Courts, L.E., DOL, prosecutors, etc.)

### Hard fix & high impact:

- Database access on holders and violators of CPL's, updated daily
- All databases current and correct
- Order to surrender allows quicker ability to put into system
  
- CPL with picture & barcode like driver's license
  
- Someone w/in judicial system that completes the paperwork to have CPL taken away
- Licensing database with easy revocation
- Dedicated CPL department with access to WASIC & NCIC
  
- Unified CPL law across all states
- Public database of who has CPL across all states


### Easy fix & high impact:

- DOL access by all stakeholders
- Database accessible to advocates

## Compliance/Enforcement of OTSWs/ERPOs

(Courts, prosecutors, and law enforcement's role.)

### Hard fix & High impact:

- FUNDING to create a firearms enforcement unit
  - We need a task force like King County
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- Make non-compliance criminal
  - Bench warrants for non-compliance
  - Prosecute those who lie about compliance (claim to have no guns or only surrender one, but still have more)
  - Real consequences → i.e. bench warrant or contempt
  - Bench warrant for FTA at compliance docket
  - Deadlines & enforceable penalties

### Hard fix & Medium impact:

- Advocates or paralegals to review — assist for better information to help better complete
- Coordinator/investigator to find out whether someone has guns or CPL

### Easy fix & High impact:

- Protocol: model policy
- Have a compliance docket

## Entry of OTSWs/ERPOs

(Entry of order on the court level, messaging at time of entry, entry into LE database, state and federal level databases, etc.)

### Hard fix & High impact:

- Extra attempts for service
- More dedicated officers to conduct service
  
- Advocates to assist in Data ENTRP & Initial information
- If the advocates entered – it would get in the system
  
- Paralegal or court advocate to review ALL paperwork
- Team @ courthouse for quality control & support
  - (1) Enter
  - (2) Review
  - (3) Make changes if necessary

### Hard fix & Low impact:

- Victim effort to get help: Victims even coming forward to to even go to a DV advocate or call law enforcement

### Easy fix & High impact:

- Checklist for judicial officers of what all is needed
- Determining the judicial entry process for judges, clerk's office, and law enforcement to use
  
- Electronic orders

## Service of OTSWs/ERPOs & Removal of Firearms

(Law enforcement work up prior to service, FA intel, risk assessment, etc.)

### Hard fix & High impact:

- Law enforcement pickup at time of service
  - Team of officers dedicated to service
  - Hire more law enforcement to serve
  - Dedicated officers/Def. for service
  - Creating a service team that serves and takes weapons at the time, and then notifies victims
  - Specialized, dedicated law enforcement trained to work with a coordinated firearms unit
  - Task-force exclusively trained in handling D.V.
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- P.D. hire DV advocates
  - Screening advocate to assist with service
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- More investigators
  - Knowledge of what to collect

### Hard fix & Low impact

- Centralized database with info for all parties
- To get buy-in: Involve all parties in a meeting
  - LE, LE union
  - All LE in jurisdiction
  - Courts, prosecutors, city officials

### Medium fix & High impact:

- Access to advance, well-developed information to retrieve firearms

### Easy fix & High impact:

- Taskforce has secure storage unit for weapons...
- Education/training for officers about Trauma, PTSD, DV
- Training for law enforcement, courts, prosecutors
