## Restricting Bulk Weapons Purchases

HB 2054 (Rep. Farivar)

Bulk purchases of firearms are a known indicator of illegal firearms trafficking. However, there is no federal limit on the amount of firearms that can be purchased during a sale. Restricting the number of firearms an individual can purchase in a given period of time helps prevent firearms from entering the secondary market, thereby reducing the flow of illegal firearms in our state.

## What the Research Says:

Restricting bulk weapons purchases is one of the best ways to ensure that dangerous weapons do not enter the black market and, ultimately, into the hands of malicious actors.

- Since the passage of the Gun Control Act of 1968 , the federal government has required that federal firearms licensees report multiple firearm purchases within five days because it is a significant indicator of arms trafficking. ${ }^{1}$
- In fact, guns sold in multiple sales were found to be $64 \%$ more likely to be involved in crime, and twice as likely to be found with their serial numbers removed, an indication of gun trafficking. ${ }^{2}$
- When this legislation was introduced in Virginia, for example, the percentage of seized trafficked firearms originating from the state dropped significantly, by $50 \%$ for guns seized in the northeast corridor. ${ }^{3}$


## Other Jurisdictions:

Washington's proposed law - one firearm purchased in a 30 day period, with exceptions for law enforcement, collectors, and others - is similar to limits in other states. Currently, five states have laws limiting the number of firearms a person can purchase each month. ${ }^{4}$

- California limits people from purchasing more than one firearm each month - this includes completed and unfinished frames and receivers.
- Maryland limits handgun and assault weapon purchases to one per month.
- New Jersey and Virginia limit handgun purchases to one per month.
- Connecticut limits handgun purchases to a maximum of 3 per month.
- New York City restricts all firearm purchases to one in 90 days.
